

NCHBA actively monitors these boards and agencies and testifies on behalf of the home building industry in order to maintain a healthy business climate and protect workforce housing. A Director of Codes and Construction is available on staff to answer any questions you may have regarding building codes and building-related issues.



NC BUILD-PAC is NCHBA's non-partisan political action committee that supports elected officials and candidates who stand behind the building industry. The NC BUILD-PAC trustees make sure those dollars are wisely spent on such elected officials and candidates.

#### **Education**



NCHBA acknowledges the dynamic nature of the building industry and offers a wide variety of educational programs for its members. NCHBA also supports our local schools and associations in their efforts to train future professionals in a construction-related field.
